Submitting a presentation

Please email Dr Jamie Ward – jamiew@sussex.ac.uk – with an abstract (no more than 250 words), together with a list of authors and their affiliations. If you are not affiliated to an academic institution, please include a CV (no more than 1 page) to help us assess your submission. Presentations will be 20 minutes long, with 10 minutes for questions and discussion. The deadline for receipt of abstracts is **8 January 2010**. Accepted abstracts will be notified soon after.

Places are limited. Those wishing to attend should register in advance using the editable registration form available on our website (payment by debit / credit card online) or by sending a cheque made payable to the "UK Synaesthesia Association" to the address on the form below. Getting to Brighton

By air: The nearest airport is Gatwick, which is 30 minutes from Brighton by train. Heathrow is approximately 1 hour away by car and also has regular National Express coach connections with Brighton.

By rail: The University of Sussex is a 5-minute walk from Falmer station, which has regular connections (approx. 10 minutes' rail journey) with Brighton station.

By car: The University is at Falmer on the A27 between Brighton and Lewes, about 4 miles from the centre of Brighton. Visitors from London and the north should take the M23/A23 road towards Brighton. Before entering the centre of Brighton, join the A27 eastbound signposted Lewes. Drivers from the east or west take the A27 direct to the University. Parking in the city centre can be expensive and hotels often allocate their parking spaces on a first-come-first-served basis.

By bus: Brighton and Hove Bus Company run several services that go to the University. The 25, 28 and 29 can all be caught at Churchill Square or Old Steine in the city centre. The 25 comes onto the campus itself (we recommend you alight at North-South Road, the closest stop to Pevensey I), while the 28 and 29 stop just outside campus (Falmer Station stop). The bus journey from the city centre takes 25-35 minutes, with the 28 and 29 taking a shorter time than the 25.

Please be aware that the University of Brighton also has a campus at Falmer – make sure to follow signs for the University of Sussex.
